



Introduction to the International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme Course

The Purpose of the class is to lay a foundation for students considering taking International Baccalaureate courses during their Junior or Senior years. The focus will be on exposing students to the IB Learner Profile that call on schools, “...to develop internationally minded people who, recognizing their common humanity and shared guardianship of the planet, help to create a better and more peaceful world. “

Students will:

- Develop a familiarity with the IB Learner Profile
- Engage in community service learning projects
- Network with other IB programs – both Primary Years Programmes and Diploma Programmed – to further their knowledge of the expectations that come along with IB.
- Have the opportunity to hear from teachers who will be instructing IB courses about what the expectations for those courses will entail.
- Be introduced to the IB DP Core: Theory of Knowledge course (TOK), Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) project, and Extended Essay (EE)
- Be important participants in spreading information on campus and in the community about the IB programme at LCC.
- Explore the Diploma Programme standards and practices through a process of inquiry
- Understand cross curricular connections and how The Introduction to IB course will be inextricably linked to all areas of curriculum on campus.
