### News regarding AP Test Enrollment

Students enrolled in Advanced Placement (AP) courses are strongly advised to take the AP exam for those courses in May. It is NOW time to register for the exams. Regular registration is February 19th– March 4th for \$93.00 per exam. Late registration is March 5,6,7 for \$115.00 per exam. Fee reductions applications are available on the Counseling website or in the Counseling Office. - ❖ **On an average day in 2006, 7,970 teens drank alcohol for the first time, a much higher number than begin smoking or trying illicit drugs.**
- ❖ **Alcohol use among children and adolescents starts early and increases rapidly with age.**

As part of a nationwide effort, our region will hold an Underage Drinking Prevention: Town Hall Meeting to increase understanding and awareness of underage drinking and its consequences, and to encourage individuals, families, and communities to address the problem. The Underage Drinking Prevention Hall Meeting will give our communities the opportunity to come together to learn more about underage drinking and its impact on both individuals and the community, and to discuss how our communities can implement the recommendations in *The Surgeon General's Call to Action* to prevent underage alcohol use. The Town Hall Meeting is designed to alert and empower the community.
