School Community

La Costa Canyon School (LCC) is a student-centered educational community, educationally serving students who live within the San Dieguito Union High School District coastal communities of Cardiff, Encinitas, Leucadia, Olivenhain, and south Carlsbad. At the start of the school year, grade 9-12 enrollment is 1700 with 446 seniors in the Class of 2024. LCC is a designated International Baccalaureate (IB) World School that offers a Diploma Programme and standalone IB courses. Our "Maverick Mindset" traits align with the IB Learner Profile, and function as a focal point for our school culture. In addition, LCC offers a robust Advanced Placement (AP) program with a broad array of course offerings. LCC is dedicated to providing each student a well-rounded education through exposure to innovative curriculum through college-bound courses as well as opportunities in career-based course pathways.

LCC provides a comprehensive interscholastic athletics program with 31 different varsity level sports, earning numerous league and CIF titles. LCC offers more than 32 extra-curricular student clubs and an Associated Student Body (ASB) to ensure each student remains connected and engaged. Large numbers of students are involved in service projects that are curriculum and community-oriented, and student-based.

Curriculum and Academic Program

Students follow a semester schedule where they can take up to seven classes per year. Students earn two final grades per course. Students who take 7 classes can earn up to 70 credits in a year. Each class is 140 minutes long on an alternating day schedule in each 18-week fall and spring term. The exception is period 1, which meets 55 minutes daily. The additional period gives students the chance to take additional electives or special programs. In addition to IB and AP, LCC offers multiple Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathways.



Distance Learning Information

2020-2022 Per July 2020 Governor's order and continuing county guidance, all SDUHSD schools remained physically closed at the start of the fall term and a distance learning model with letter grades and full curriculum was implemented through the second quarter. Per CA Assembly Bill 104 (7/2021), all students in grades 9-12 in 2020-2021 were given the option to request to change any letter grade to CR/NC. In 2021-2022 per CA Assembly Bill 130 (7/2021), districts were temporarily required to offer an Independent Study option only to students whose health would be put at risk by in-person instruction, as determined by the parent or guardian. This included long-term and short-term Independent Study offerings via an online learning platform and letter grades were issued.

Online Learning Program - SDUHSD offers a voluntary independent study online learning program option using Edgenuity coursework and asynchronous and synchronous instruction concurrent with the residential high school terms.
